Before registration, Trust has started a “Pilot Project” to create awareness of Information Technology and Computer Education in the interior and remote villages of Arunachal Pradesh and Assam, hence within a span of 5 years Trust has established 11 computer centers in the name and title of “Access – I.T. 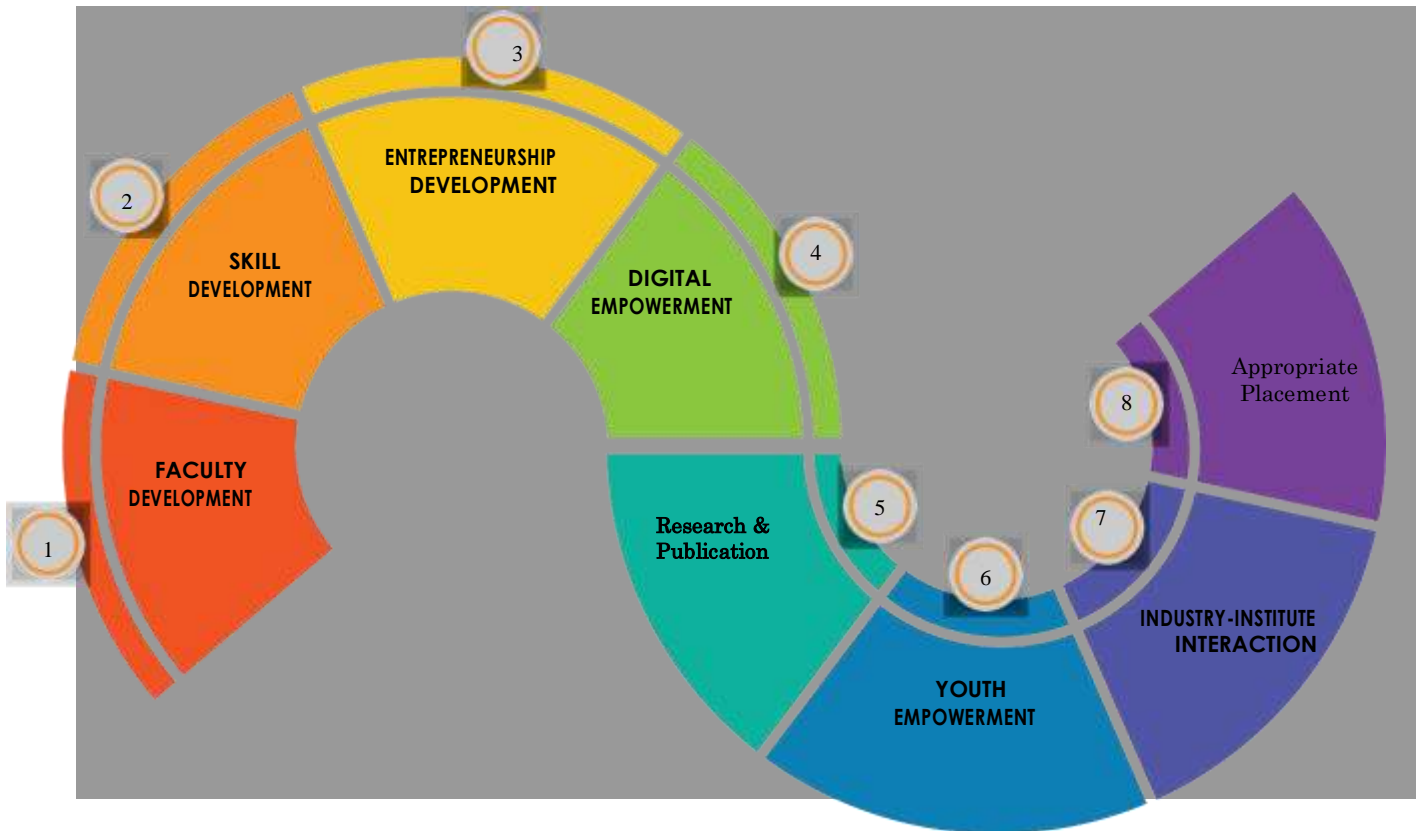

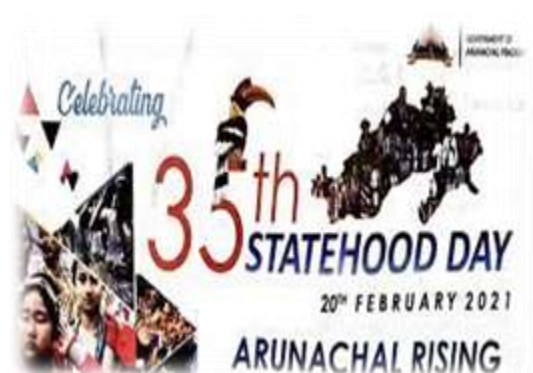
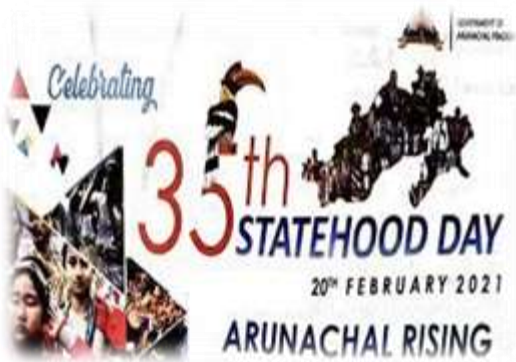

The COVID-19 pandemic is the greatest global humanitarian challenge the world has faced since World War II. The virus has spread widely, and the number of cases is rising daily as governments work to slow its spread. India had moved swiftly, implementing a proactive, nationwide, 21-day lockdown, with the goal of flattening the curve and using the time to plan and resource responses adequately. India's effort to combat COVID-19 virus has been praised over the globe. However, the lockdown came with an economic cost and cascading impact on all the sections of society. The Covid-19 induced lockdown in India was a huge economic shock. It started across the country on 24 March 2020 and is still ongoing with restrictions in one form or other. It stalled the economy with complete closure imposed on enterprises across all sectors. Even though agricultural activities were exempted, in the initial phases of the lockdown the agriculture value chain also faced large-scale disruptions. This had a serious detrimental effect on the rural Indian economy. The coronavirus pandemic has also triggered a massive reverse migration from the urban to rural areas in large parts of the country.

The first case of the COVID-19 pandemic in India was reported on 30 January 2020, originating from China. Slowly, the pandemic spread to various states and union territories including the state of Arunachal Pradesh. The first case was recorded in this region on 2 April 2020. As of February 2, 2022, more than 1.26 million cases of COVID-19 have been confirmed in Arunachal Pradesh.

COVID-19 Lockdown has already puts Poor at Risk and disproportionately hurt marginalized communities due to loss of livelihood and lack of food, shelter, health, and other basic needs. Skill Development Program- GDA Training under PMKVY – 3.0

Need For the GDA Course: Rising skill gap has emerged to be one of the key barriers in healthcare sector. Skill gap in healthcare is approximately 97.9% across various health workforce categories in India. (Source: Ministry of Health and Family Welfare) The burden of rising healthcare costs and rapidly increasing population has further widened this gap, making it difficult for country to equate healthcare needs with existing means.

Bethel Life care Charitable Trust working Since 2014 towards skill development training on various sectors. In this year also we have conducted vocational training on GDA course under PMKVY -3.0 against CSSM Component of Arunachal Pradesh Skill Development Mission.

This programme is designed to provide quality care to patients admitted in nursing homes and hospitals. As part of the curriculum, students learn how to provide basic nursing care and manage ill patients. A GDA works in close collaboration with doctors, nurses and other healthcare providers laying special emphasis on inculcating empathetic and ethical behavior beyond patient care. Their daily job is to maintain a suitable environment for patients during their recovery period.

MEDP Training on FOOD Processing & Bakery through Support of NABARD



A separate, specific and focused skill building programme 'Micro Enterprise Development Programme (MEDP)' has been formulated which involves organizing short duration, location specific programmes on skill upgradation / development for sustainable livelihoods / venturing micro-enterprises by matured SHG members. It is a supplemental effort to upgrade/ develop skill and preliminary business acumen of

SHG members in order to enable them to cope up with the issues in relation to run a successful enterprise for income generation/ livelihood.

BLCT provided MEDP training with the support of NABARD this year. Workshop for Food Processing & Bakery was held for SHG members of Changlang at Changlang District for 15 days in which 30 trainees were provided training. Guidance was also provided to trainees after the completion of program.



Two Shaft Handloom Weaving –NABARD (Skill Development Training)

The programme was sponsored by National Bank for Agricultural and Rural Development (NABARD), Arunachal Pradesh Regional Office, Itanagar and implemented by, Bethel Life Care Charitable Trust (BLCCT) in this year. The 43 days long Skill Development Programme (SDP) on “Two Shaft Handloom Weaving”, for 30 unemployed women of Changlang implemented by us. This program is aimed at training candidates for the job of a”Two shaft handloom weaver”, in the “Textile” Sector/Industry and aims at building the following key competencies amongst the learner.

After completing this programme, participants will be able to:

- Carry out pre weaving activities
- Learn and familiar to operate the loom machine
- Contribute to achieve quality in handloom weaving
- Maintain work area, tools and machines
- Gain behavioral skill for team working
- Maintain health, safety and security at work place
- Comply with industry and organizational requirement



Hand Embroidery Skill Development Training – Supported by NABARD



The 30 days Skill Development Programme (SDP) on “Hand Embroidery”, The programme was sponsored by National Bank for Agricultural and Rural Development (NABARD), Arunachal Pradesh Regional Office, Itanagar and implemented by, Bethel Life Care Charitable Trust (BLCT)

in this year.

The course is structured keeping in mind that it is targeted for someone with no prior experience in embroidery. It starts with the basics – from a background of embroidery in Changlang, to different needles, threads and embroidery materials and evolves to hands-on training.

After Completion A course A Hand Embroiderer embroiders decorative designs on fabric & other materials by hand, using needle & thread. The hand embroiderer uses a variety of sewing techniques to create different kinds of embroidery stitches & effects such as Cross stitch, French knot stitch, Bullion knot stitch, Shade work, Applique work, English Smocking etc. The job requires the hand embroiderer to have the skills to stitch a variety of Flat stitches, Loop stitches and Knotted stitches.

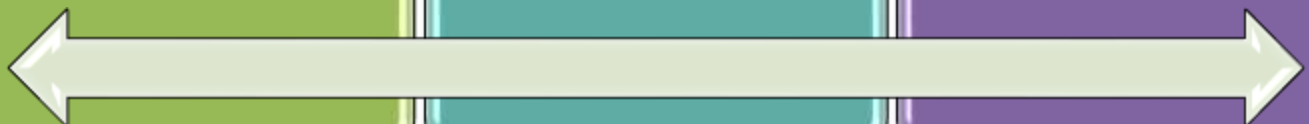

4.Details Of Implementing: -

Arunachal Pradesh, which literally means “land of dawn-lit mountains,” is India’s most eastern state. To the south, it shares borders with Assam and Nagaland. Arunachal Pradesh culture is really diverse. Each tribe has its own set of traditions and customs. Colourful festivals define Arunachal’s cultural lifestyle. Because HANDLOOM, HANDICRAFTS AND AGRICULTURE is the backbone here, people typically celebrate festivals as a way of thanking the Almighty for a bountiful crop. These festivities also highlight the various tribes’ creative abilities. Handlooms are the centre of the domestic economy of **CHANGLANG**, Arunachal Pradesh traditionally handloom every family had looms to meet the requirements of the household. The most prominent tribal ethnic communities which have highly distinguished Handloom weaving skills, Varieties of artistically distinguished textiles are woven by the tribal women. According to tradition, the skill at weaving is the primary qualification for a young girl’s eligibility for marriage. The techniques of handloom weaving are handed down across generations. Though essentially a female craft, both men and women practice handloom weaving.

Evolution/History of Cluster:

CHANGLANG village in **CHANGLANG** district is inhabited by shepherd families since time immemorial. Many of whom started Handloom Weaving from wool and thread. They have learnt the skill of making Handloom products; this has been their ancestral professions making Handloom products became their main livelihood activities. As the people follow their old style of inherited skills in making **HANDLOOM PRODUCTS** they do most of the job manually, **HANDLOOM PRODUCTS** that is also done manually. Some families are having manual looms for making handloom products.

- Traditional method of production causing low productivity.
- Lack of techniques/ technology
- No modern packing
- Non adoption of latest technology leading to low productivity
- Lack of skills
- Lack of modern machinery

Objective:

1. To ensure economic and social security of 200 artisans and their families from 14 villages spread Over 01 block in **CHANGLANG** district under Arunachal Pradesh.
2. To form OFPO with the active participation of artisans towards promotion and expansion of the Cluster market in and around the country.
3. To provide value added service including developing new designs, products and providing Support to the artisans by upgrading their technical and marketing skills
4. Identify the gaps/ lapses in the raw materials supply, production process and marketing and Facilitate the required common facilities to the handloom weavers in order to produce Value-added products
5. To establish financial linkages with banks, financial institutes and promotional agencies under Different schemes of Central and State Government and strengthening the backward and Forward linkages.
6. To achieve sustainability, competitiveness and growth of the cluster.

Present Production Process



PRESENT Marketing Method

Spinning the cotton threads using a traditional handmade thread roller and then using a rustic charka, to roll the threads into a spool. Several spools of cotton threads go into the making of a handloom fabric.

Warping is the process of creating the base yarn that runs along the length of fabric through which the “weft” yarns are filled in to make the fabric. Traditionally warp width in a loin loom is much smaller in comparison to fly shuttle loom due to its narrow size.



This step involves placing the long yarn onto the loom. The yarn is stretched between two parallel bamboos and the other end is strapped to the weaver's waist. The yarn is interlaced with pick-up sticks and weaving comb.

In this step, weft threads are interlaced with the warped thread drawn through heddles. This is an intricate process. It is the interlacing of the waft and weft which creates the fabric.



The handloom fabric is created by the use of hands and the feet to raise the waft and allow the passage of stick shuttle. Unlike a fly shuttle loom, the Loin loom consists of a heavy shuttle stick which carries the thread that interlaces the waft threads at a right angle, thus creating the hand woven fabric.

Present Marketing Method: Traditional method through weekly market or rural haats, demand ordered by party or departments.

6	PUTUL	It is a flat bamboo stick of suitable length and is used to keep the woven cloth stretched horizontally to avoid folding.
7	GAGAR	It is a medium size wooden cuboidal beam of suitable length with depression at both ends. It is used to tie the weaving back strap belt
8	TAPING SANKYO	It is a thin bamboo stick where the threads are rolled and used as a throw shuttle
9	GAETAH	It is a back strap belt made up of bamboo, clothes and leather, which are kept around the weaver back. This belt helps to create the necessary tension in loom by stretching legs against the foot rest.

Challenges foreseen for Artisans Project

<i>Sr. No.</i>	<i>Challenges</i>
1	There are so many restriction and constraint in local handloom weavers. There is a constraint in demand, which is limited to local markets only. Due to this limitation there is a huge gap between demand and supply.
2	There are limited products, design and pattern, which are offered by the weavers. Due to lack of design and pattern product are not sold beyond the local jurisdiction.
3	There is competition from national and international brands. Also, there are regular changes in taste and preference amongst the consumer because of which there is fall in demand also.
4	The marginal handloom weaver who are toiling days and nights to earn livelihoods are left out from development process. They are frequently cheated by middle men who do not works but procure handloom items from real workers at cheap rate and earn optimum profits.

Baseline Survey on Biodiversity Risk



The expansion of human capacity to conserve biodiversity, to manage its use, and to address threats to it. This strategy has three main components: a) increasing public appreciation and awareness of the value and importance of biodiversity, and public involvement in its conservation and sustainable use; b) improving the understanding of biodiversity through conducting research, improving

biological inventories, establishing and maintaining monitoring systems, sharing information, and incorporating traditional knowledge, and; c) strengthening existing management capacity through appropriate training.

Tengmo village is located in Jairampur circle of Changlang district in Arunachal Pradesh, India. It is situated 12km away from sub-district headquarter Jairampur (tehsildar office) and 102km away from district headquarter Changlang. The location is naturally abundant with forest reserve with river and water fall. To explain a conservation of Biodiversity we have conduct a training workshop at Tengmo village. On this workshop we have trained our employees to how to collect the data of Biodiversity conservation from local community of Tengmo village. Basically local tribal people totally deepened on forest resource for their livelihood so it is a need to guide them for biodiversity conservation for this task we have prepared a baseline data format to collect exact information about endangered species. So we have trained our team at the workshop.
