




LIVELIHOOD



Skill Development Programmes

Sewing Machine Operator

BLCCT, in collaboration with NABARD and ArSRLM, successfully completed a 47-day Skill Development Programme on Sewing Machine Operator at Alubari, Chongkham. Over **30 rural women** participated in the training, gaining hands-on skills aligned with the NSQF curriculum of NSDC.



At the valedictory function, trainees showcased their garments, received completion certificates, and top designs were awarded. As a result of the programme, 10 trainees secured placements at Shahi Exports Pvt. Ltd., Bengaluru, while others established their own enterprises in the Alubari area.

То further strengthen their entrepreneurial **BLCCT** journey, supported **SHGs** and trainees Registration obtaining Udyam Certificates under MSME, marking a vital toward self-reliance sustainable livelihood opportunities.





Empowering Women Through Successful Trainee Placements



As part of the placement drive, Shri Abhijit Majumdar, General Manager/Officer in Charge of Reserve Bank of India, Itanagar, flagged off the vehicle transporting the trainees, who will be travelling by train from Tinsukia to Bangalore. Officials from various banks were present during the occasion.

10 trainees have secured placements at "Shahi Exports" in Bangalore, Karnataka.





Project Placement and Enterprise Outcomes:

- 10 SHG women placed at Shahi Exports, Bangalore, earning Rs. 14,000/month with EPF and ESI benefits.
- 13 SHG women started micro-enterprises under MSME, earning an additional Rs. 5,000–12,000/month.
- 76.67% of project participants are now successfully settled through employment or entrepreneurship, demonstrating the project's impact in promoting sustainable livelihoods and economic empowerment.

Beauty & Wellness

BLCCT, with sponsorship from NABARD Guwahati and in collaboration with ASRLM, completed a 49-day Skill Development Programme on Beauty Therapist in Tinsukia.

- 30 unemployed women trained as professional beauty therapists.
- 390 hours of training: 15 days theory + 34 days practical.
- Certificates awarded at the valedictory ceremony on 25th June 2024 at Technology Park, Tinsukia.
- Supported by dignitaries from NABARD, RSETI, PNB, ASRLM, and industry experts.
- Trainees are now qualified to work in salons/wellness centres or start their own enterprises.

This initiative has opened pathways for women to secure employment and self-reliance in the growing beauty and wellness sector.











A total of 30 unemployed women were trained, achieving a 72% placement and settlement rate. The average remuneration for the placed candidates ranged between Rs. 8,500 and Rs. 10,000. Out of the trained participants, 15 were successfully employed in various beauty and spa centres, parlours, and wellness centres, while 7 participants initiated self-employment ventures from home.

Strengthening Handloom cluster under REC/CFC Model

On November 14, 2024, the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) launched a Skill Development Programme (SDP) on Computerized Embroidery for **50 artisans** in Nongtham, Kharsang, Changlang District. This initiative, a collaboration with the Nongtham Handloom Cluster Producers Co. Ltd., aims to empower rural women and uplift the local handloom sector.

The program, which includes the establishment of a Rural Experience Centre (REC) equipped with six computerized embroidery machines, provides vital training and capacity building.

The inauguration, attended by Shri Kamlung Mosang, Hon'ble MLA, and officials from SIDBI, NABARD, and ArSRLM, highlighted the importance of such initiatives for sustainable rural development. The NABARD District Development Manager also emphasized the significance of Geographical Indication (GI) status for Arunachal Pradesh's products, which will help artisans secure better prices and protect authenticity. As part of Vigilance Awareness Week 2024, attendees also took an "Integrity Pledge." This comprehensive program marks a significant stride toward promoting skill development and economic empowerment in the region.













Empowering Handloom Cluster under Project - "Hastavem"

The HASTAVEM project, launched on February 7, 2025, in Nongtham, Changlang District, represents a significant convergence of efforts to empower rural women. This initiative builds on the foundation laid by the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI), which sponsored a **Rural Experience Centre (REC)** equipped with **06** computerized embroidery machines and training.

HASTAVEM, supported by SeSTA and ArSRLM, expands this skill-building by providing comprehensive training in both handloom weaving and computerized embroidery to 25 women. The convergence of SIDBI's initial machinery support with HASTAVEM's upskilling efforts has successfully arrested the entire textile embroidery business into the community, which was earlier outflowing to neighbouring states. This collaboration marks a major step forward for the Nongtham Handloom Cluster.







A significant Output in Handloom Cluster

The women trained in computerized machine embroidery have begun making their own products, which they are selling in local markets, within their communities, and at SHG melas. With support and collaboration from ArSRLM, the Nongtham Handloom Cluster is now producing handloom and embroidery products within the cluster itself, reducing reliance on outside service providers. This has allowed women to earn directly from their work while preserving traditional Tangsa handloom designs. A total of 75 SHG women received training and capacity-building support in handloom weaving with computerized embroidery under SIDBI and SeSTA initiatives. About 70% of the trained women now earn an additional Rs. 5,000 to 7,000 per month, contributing significantly to their livelihoods.









BLCCT facilitated the participation of the Nongtham Handloom Cluster at the International Pangsau Pass Festival (PPIF) 2025, where Tangsa textiles were showcased. This exposure not only highlighted the rich cultural heritage of the community but also opened new avenues for market linkages and the promotion of local handloom products. Furthermore, with the Tangsa handloom textile receiving Geographical Indication (GI) status, the traditional craft has gained a stronger identity in regional and national markets, enhancing its recognition and value.







Trained 75 SHG Women, got capacity building support in Handloom Weaving with Computerised Machine Embroidery under SIDBI & SeSTA support, 70% trained women earns Rs.5000 to 7000 per month as an additional income for their livelihood.

Capacity Building Workshop on E-Commerce & ONDC Onboarding

With NABARD's support, a 2-day training programme (8th–10th April) was organized in Namsai for SHGs, JLGs, Producer Organizations (POs), and microentrepreneurs. BLCCT in collaboration with Interim Technologies Pvt. Ltd., the focused on onboarding and marketing products through e-commerce, social media, and ONDC platforms. Participants received training in digital literacy, branding, packaging, compliance, digital payments, and logistics, enhancing their skills to access digital marketplaces, diversify income streams, and achieve economic empowerment. 25 micro enterprises got support to onboard their handloom, handicraft and other off farm products in E-Commerce platform.









Handloom Cluster Success Story

Celebrating Excellence in Weaving: Nyano Chithan

On National Handloom Day (7th August 2024), we proudly celebrated Nyano Chithan, who was awarded the prestigious title of State Best Weaver.

Hailing from the serene village of Neirong, Namphai Circle, Nyano emerged as a beacon of dedication and artistry in the weaving community. Since 2016, she had been serving as a Master Trainer at Navi Weaving Centre, Nongtham, under the Nongtham Handloom Cluster Production Company Limited, where she worked tirelessly to preserve and promote traditional weaving techniques.

Her journey reflected the strength of collaboration—mentored and supported by BLCCT, facilitated by the Tangsa Baptist Churches Association, and empowered through a program grant from the Department of Skill Development (Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh), Entrepreneurship, and NABARD. The Nongtham Handloom Cluster Production Company further nurtured her path to success.





Women Achievers Award: Nyano Chithan

Itanagar, March 8, 2025 – On the occasion of International Women's Day, the Women and Child Development Department, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, honoured Mrs. Nyano Chithan Mungrey with the prestigious Women Achievers Award in the category of Preservation of Indigenous Art.



A dedicated weaving instructor at the Navi Weaving Training Centre, spearheaded by Nongtham Handloom Cluster Producer Company Ltd. and promoted by Bethel Life Care Charitable Trust, Mrs. Mungrey has been at the forefront of safeguarding Arunachal Pradesh's rich weaving heritage. Her relentless efforts in promoting and preserving traditional weaving practices have not only empowered local artisans but also ensured the continuity of indigenous craftsmanship in modern times.

By imparting skills to aspiring weavers and nurturing sustainable livelihoods, Mrs. Mungrey has become a beacon of inspiration, reinforcing the vital role of traditional art in sustaining cultural identity. This recognition underscores both her personal dedication and the government's commitment to celebrating women who are making remarkable contributions to cultural preservation and community empowerment.

From Training to Employment: Empowering Rural Youth as Security Guards



(SDP) on "Unarmed Security Guard" sponsored by NABARD in collaboration with the District Administration and ArSRLM, Over **30 youth** were trained through 6 days of theory and 24 days of practical sessions, including inputs on first aid, firefighting, and traffic management. Trainees are now equipped to work as security guards in cities such as Guwahati, Chennai, and Hyderabad.

Under the Skill Development Programme



In Khonsa **30 rural youth** were trained with skills on unarmed security guard. Sponsored by NABARD in partnership with the District Administration Tirap and the local NGO Seva Samithy, the month-long training combined theory with hands-on practice in fire safety, traffic control, and first aid.



The valedictory ceremony was graced by Ms. Ira Singhal, IAS, Deputy Commissioner of Tirap, as Chief Guest. The event also saw the presence of Shri S. Sinapho, Superintendent of Police: Dr. Neeba Lowang, District Medical Officer; Shri Kamal Roy, DDM NABARD; Shri Chandan Prasad, Founder & CEO of BLCCT; and Shri Jaawang Lowangcha, Secretary of Seva Samithy, alongside all trainees.

The programme prepared participants to take up employment as unarmed security guards in Tier-1 and Tier-2 cities across India, marking an important step toward youth empowerment and livelihood generation in Tirap.

Placement Drive Outcomes: 10 Participants Secured Employment

On 4th February 2025, 10 newly selected security guards from Tirap and Namsai successfully completed intensive training under the Unarmed Security Guard Program, supported by NABARD in collaboration with Seva Samithy, Khonsa. Following their training, the candidates have were placed in JEI Security, Guwahati.

Tribal Jewellery Cluster Development

Cultural Preservation & Livelihood Generation in Longding

A skill training program on Tribal Jewellery Making was inaugurated at Longding on 25th October. The program was sponsored by the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) in collaboration with Tribal Fashion Jewellery and ArSRLM, Longding.







The training program was successfully conducted, with **50 participants** actively engaged in learning the art of bead making. The participants demonstrated remarkable dedication and commitment throughout the program. This initiative not only fostered economic empowerment among the participants but also contributed to the preservation and promotion of traditional tribal culture.



Valedictory programme on Tribal Jewellery Making

A 15-day Skill Development Training on Tribal Jewellery Making was successfully concluded at Longding from December 4–18, 2024,



attended 50 The training. bv local beneficiaries, focused on imparting skills in Wancho tribal jewellery design, material selection. and production techniques. The initiative only promoted economic not and self-reliance empowerment but contributed to the preservation of traditional culture.

During the program, a financial literacy awareness session by the CRISIL Foundation emphasized savings, financial planning, and government schemes such as the Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana (SSY). The event concluded with certificate distribution and showcasing of jewellery crafted by trainees.



The valedictory ceremony, held at the Circuit House, Longding, was graced by Mirpe Tato (ADC, Longding), Mibin Dirchi (Promotion Officer, Handicraft), Kaling Taling (Textile & Handicraft Department), along with representatives from CRISIL Foundation and the BLCCT team, including Founder & CEO Chandan Prasad, Program Manager Lucky Chutia, and Project Coordinator Shrabana Sharma.



Strengthening Rural Livelihoods: The Diyun Rural Haat Initiative

The Rural Haat Management Committee (RHMC) meeting for the newly sanctioned Rural Haat in Diyun, Changlang District, sponsored by NABARD, was convened under the chairmanship of BLCCT. It was discussed that the project will be implemented by BLCCT in collaboration with Krishisparsh Agro Producers Co. Ltd., a local Farmers' Producer Company.

The upcoming Rural Haat is designed to provide improved market infrastructure, including a market shed with raised platform, storage room with office space, sanitation facilities with water supply, solar lighting, and a compost pit for solid waste disposal. This initiative aims to strengthen market linkages and enhance livelihood opportunities for the farming community.



Foundation Stone Laying - Diyun Rural Haat

The foundation stone for the Diyun Rural Haat in Changlang District was laid as part of a NABARD-funded initiative. The project was designed to provide a structured and permanent marketplace for local farmers and Agri-producers.

With improved infrastructure and organized facilities, the Rural Haat will enhance market access, strengthen rural livelihoods, and promote sustainable agricultural practices. This initiative is expected to make a significant positive impact on the farming community of the region.











A Boost to Rural Tourism

During the Pangsau Pass International Festival, BLCCT, in collaboration with ArSRLM Nampong, initiated efforts to create and promote Rural Homestays in the Nampong area.

The first phase of homestay registration and consultation meeting was held on 1st December 2024 at the Inspection Bungalow, Nampong. The meeting was led by Rani Linggi (BMM, ArSRLM), along with Rahul Tikhak (Secretary, PPIF), and representatives from BLCCT and ArSRLM. A total of 56 SHG households registered for the opportunity.

During the session, the importance of rural homestays in promoting sustainable tourism and boosting the local economy was highlighted. Focus group discussions were also conducted with beneficiaries, and the process of homestay creation was explained. Hospitality and Management training was organized by BLCCT after finalization of shortlisted beneficiaries.





CSR Initiative: Empowering Women through Traditional Craftsmanship

Baseline and Resource Mapping program was conducted in Alubari (Chowkham) and Jona (Namsai). Supported by the CSR initiative of CMS Foundation in convergence with ArSRLM, the program focuses on capacity building in Sewing Machine Operation and Candle Making.

A total of **100 rural women** from SHGs were identified for the Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP), fostering skills, self-reliance, and livelihood opportunities.









Gram Samriddhi - A BLCCT's programme initiative

Gram Samriddhi

"Gram Samriddhi", meaning "village prosperity," is a BLCCT initiative focused on holistic rural development. In collaboration with ArSRLM, selected villages are adopted based on community needs and government priorities. Through participatory assessments and multi-sectoral convergence - covering livelihoods, education, health, and capacity building - BLCCT implements or facilitates interventions to ensure sustained, inclusive village prosperity.

Meeting with BMMU ArSRLM on SHG Potential & Lakhpati Didi Identification under Gram Samriddhi

Following the launch of the Gram Samriddhi initiative, the BLCCT team continued its field engagement to understand and support rural livelihoods. On Thursday, September 18, 2025, the team met with Mr. Ashen Chaitom and Mr. Ronald Dkhar Bagwar, Block Mission Managers (BMMs) from ArSRLM's Lekang and Namsai Blocks, to assess the specific livelihood needs and opportunities in their regions. The discussions provided valuable insights into baseline conditions, areas requiring targeted interventions, and the support needed to strengthen Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and identify potential Lakhpati Didis. Based on the BMMs' recommendations, BLCCT plans to adopt 2–3 villages per block under the Gram Samriddhi initiative.



Through this program, rural women and farmers will be provided with maximum opportunities via diverse activities, capacity-building programs, and hands-on mentoring. A key focus of the initiative is close convergence with line departments and ArSRLM, ensuring sustained guidance, handholding, and impactful development in the adopted villages.



Following the field engagements under the Gram Samriddhi initiative, on 30th October 2024, BLCCT participated in a meeting with key stakeholders to review activities under BMMU, Maio Block. The meeting was attended by BMM officials from Maio and Vijaynagar, the Block Coordinator, and the BLCCT leadership team. The session facilitated a constructive exchange of information, with the BMMs and Block Coordinator sharing updates on ongoing initiatives. The discussions provided valuable insights, helping BLCCT better understand local priorities and challenges, and guiding the planning of its future interventions in the Maio Block.



Village Resource Mapping - Tengmo Village

As part of the Gram Samriddhi initiative, BLCCT, in collaboration with ArSRLM Nampong Block, has been implementing a series of activities in Tengmo Village, Changlang District, aimed at promoting sustainable livelihoods and village prosperity.

On 2nd February 2025, the team conducted a Village Resource Mapping exercise under the Village Adoption Program. Using Participatory Learning and Action (PLA) tools, SHG members and villagers were actively engaged in assessing local resources, challenges, and development needs. Findings from a baseline survey of 30 SHG members highlighted priority areas for intervention, underscoring the need for targeted livelihood programs.









Capacity Building Training – Gram Samriddhi Tengmo Village

On 18th February 2025, BLCCT, with support from NABARD and IIE, and in collaboration with ArSRLM Nampong Block, launched a capacity-building training program on candle making and bakery in Tengmo Village, Changlang District.

A total of 30 SHG members are participating in the training. The inauguration was attended by ArSRLM officials, community leaders, and BLCCT representatives, who encouraged active engagement and learning. Through hands-on training, beneficiaries are being equipped with practical skills to generate income, strengthen local livelihoods, and contribute to the economic development of their community.









Bakery Intervention - Gram Samriddhi, Tengmo Village

25 rural women from Tengmo Village, Changlang District, participated in a capacity-building training in bakery skills. Organized jointly by BLCCT and ArSRLM Nampong Block, the program equipped SHG members with practical entrepreneurial skills. By learning bakery techniques, participants gained opportunities for sustainable income generation, enhanced self-reliance, and meaningful contribution to the local economy.



Candle-Making Training – Gram Samriddhi, Tengmo Village

Another initiative saw BLCCT, in collaboration with ArSRLM Nampong Block, organize a capacity-building training on candle making for members of the Tengmo SHG. The training was conducted by Ms. Pinki Sonuwal (CRPEP, UMANG CLF, Namsai Block), a successful micro-entrepreneur from "JUNAK," who shared her expertise in soy and paraffin wax crafting.

Supported by NABARD, the program aimed to strengthen women's entrepreneurial skills and promote sustainable livelihood opportunities. By mastering candle making, participants took a significant step toward self-reliance and economic empowerment, opening avenues for income generation and local enterprise development.









Candle Making Success Story

Pinki Sonowal - From Learner to Entrepreneur

Pinki Sonowal, Master Trainer and CRPEP under UMANG CLF, Namsai Block, stands as a shining example of BLCCT's NABARD-supported capacity-building initiatives. Through the MEDP Candle Making Training, sponsored by NABARD and facilitated by BLCCT, Pinki transformed her skills into a thriving microenterprise, "JUNAK."

From crafting soy and paraffin wax candles to running a successful business, Pinki's journey reflects the true impact of skill development. Over the last three years, her growth has not only provided for her family but also inspired fellow SHG members to pursue entrepreneurship.



Lighting the Path to Self-Reliance: Junmoni's "Roshni" Candle Venture

From a remote village in Arunachal Pradesh, Junmoni turned a spark of opportunity into a thriving enterprise—"**Roshni"** candles. What began with a simple training program sponsored by NABARD grew into a powerful story of resilience and entrepreneurship.

Through structured training and ongoing mentorship, Junmoni not only mastered the art of candle making but also built a sustainable business that supports her family and inspires her community. Her journey demonstrates the transformative power of skill development, institutional support, and women's entrepreneurship in strengthening livelihoods and fostering self-reliance.







Village Adoption Initiative Meeting in Honkap Village

On 28th November 2024, a meeting was conducted in Honkap Village under the Village Adoption Initiative. The discussions focused on:

- Conducting a baseline survey for SHG profiling
- Planning demand-based capacity building initiatives
- Exploring income-generating livelihood opportunities
- Providing handholding support to SHGs

Two SHGs, Manchan SHG and Phanman SHG, participated enthusiastically in the meeting. The initiative aims to create sustainable livelihood opportunities, foster community development, and promote economic growth in rural areas.





Baseline Survey & Resource Mapping - Balinong

As part of the Village Adoption Initiative, BLCCT, with support from NABARD and in partnership with the Rëra Welfare Society and Balinong Youth Association, conducted a Baseline Survey, Social & Resource Mapping program in Balinong Village. The exercise introduced participatory tools such as PRA and RRA, encouraging the community to actively envision its development path.





The program was enriched by the presence of Shri Saurabh Sharma (ED, SANJOG & NET Convener), who engaged participants with the question: "What Balinong do you envision in the next ten years?" His insights on agriculture, livelihood diversification, and financial growth inspired meaningful dialogue.

With active participation from Self-Help Groups (SHGs), Gaon Burha, Panchayat members, youth, public leaders, and government officials, the program established a strong foundation of collaboration. Key opportunities identified include leveraging government entitlements, promoting tourism, strengthening farming practices, supporting SHGs through exposure tours, and revitalizing handloom and weaving.



Organization Development Activities with NoDe SeSTA

BLCCT Shortlisted for Village Innovation Pitch by SeSTA

BLCCT was shortlisted for the Village Innovation Pitch organized by Seven Sisters Development Assistance (SeSTA), in recognition of its innovative approach and commitment to fostering sustainable grassroots development.



MIS Workshop, Guwahati

From 19th–21st June 2024, BLCCT's CEO, Program Manager, and Project Coordinator participated in a three-day Workshop on Management Information System (MIS) in Guwahati, organized by SeSTA along with 13 other CSOs. The workshop enhanced their capacity to use MIS as a tool for decision-making, coordination, analysis, and effective information management. They gained practical insights from other CSOs on tracking project progress, data-driven reporting, and program monitoring. The knowledge acquired will be applied to strengthen BLCCT's internal systems, improve program efficiency, and support evidence-based decision-making across all initiatives.



Training on Accounting and Financial Management

Our Accounts Assistant participated in a two-day Accounts and Finance training organized by SeSTA under the NODE program. The sessions provided valuable and practical knowledge. insights enhancing participants' skills accounting and financial management. The training has strengthened our ability to manage finances effectively and will be used to improve day-to-day financial operations and reporting at BLCCT.



Proposal Writing Training

BLCCT staff attended a two-day training on Proposal Writing organized by NODE SeSTA, facilitated by Mr. Shivaji. The workshop gave them practical guidance on structuring proposals, setting objectives, budgeting, and demonstrating project impact. Staff found the sessions very useful for understanding how to clearly present project ideas and gained confidence in preparing proposals for donors and partner organizations. The knowledge acquired will be applied in upcoming project proposals, helping BLCCT secure support and improve planning and reporting for its initiatives.



Organizational Development Workshop

On 15–16 October, the CEO, Program Manager, and Project Coordinator took part in a two-day Organizational Development (OD) workshop organized by NODE SeSTA. The sessions focused on improving internal processes, team coordination, and project management practices. The participants gained practical tips to make BLCCT's operations smoother and more organized. These insights will help the organization work more efficiently and deliver better results in its programs.







In-person support to BLCCT

On July 8–9, 2024, Ms. Neha Saikia, Trainer from NODE-SeSTA, visited BLCCT H.O. for an observation visit. She reviewed compliance status and past workshops on Financial Management, Leadership & Governance, Livelihood Practices, and MIS & MEL, while also discussing action plans and organizational needs. On July 9, she undertook a field visit to Chowkham block (Aspirational District Namsai), interacting with SHG members and beneficiaries of the NABARD–ArSRLM supported sewing machine operator training implemented by BLCCT. She also engaged with village-level entrepreneurs promoted under the Start-Up Village Entrepreneurship Program. The visit was joined by BLCCT staff, ArSRLM representatives, and a TISS intern.







Peer Learning Assessment

BLCCT participated in a peer learning assessment organized by Seven Sisters Development Assistance (SeSTA) and Axis Bank Foundation under the NODE Program, along with partner organizations PRDA and Aman Foundation. During the visit to SANJOG, Nalbari, and Rongmei Baptist Association, Nagaland, the team gained practical insights into livestock rearing, integrated farming, and innovative sawdust mushroom cultivation techniques. The experience also provided an opportunity to observe how partner organizations manage community engagement, training, and farm-based enterprises effectively. This exposure has equipped BLCCT with valuable knowledge and skills that will be applied to strengthen farm-based initiatives, improve program planning, and enhance the overall impact of our interventions in the communities we serve.









NoDe Peer Learning Visit at BLCCT

On October 20th and 21st, as part of the NODE Program organized by Seven Sisters Development Assistance (SeSTA) and Axis Bank Foundation, a peer learning visit and assessment were conducted by People Endeavour for Social Change (PESH) and Rural Aid Service (RAS) at Bethel Life Care Charitable Trust (BLCCT). During the visit, the partner organizations conducted a detailed evaluation of BLCCT's internal and external systems. They also observed BLCCT-supported handloom and weaving centres, including carpet weaving initiatives, and visited the NABARD-sponsored Rural Mart. The visit provided valuable insights into BLCCT's community development projects, support for local artisans, and the overall functioning of its livelihood programs.







CSO Alliance & Fellowship

Northeast RCRC Partners Meet, Guwahati

Our Project Coordinator attended the two-day Northeast RCRC Partners Meet in Guwahati, chaired and inaugurated by Sri Loken Das, CGM NABARD. The event brought together 50 CSOs from six north-eastern states, fostering collaboration and knowledge exchange. Key attendees included M.J. Arvind (Dhwani Foundation), Thomas Pullenkav & Chongnei Moi (Selco Foundation), Kabita Devi (Manipur SRLM), and Srajesh Gupta (C-Gem). The meet served as a platform to share ideas and strengthen collective efforts for advancing development in the Northeast.





Building Ecosystem for Arunachal Civil Society Organization

Northeast Together Network conducted a two-day "Orientation Program on Organization Development for Non-Profit Organizations of Arunachal Pradesh" at Namsai on 12th and 13th September 2024. The program also marked the formation of the "Arunachal Pradesh NGO State Alliance", bringing together seven prominent NGOs from across the state to strengthen the social sector and build an ecosystem where CSOs understand the importance of legal compliance and organizational development.

After attending several organizational development workshops, BLCCT collaborated with Northeast Together Network to organize this program, giving local NGOs a chance to learn from shared experiences and capacity-building exercises. NGOs from Namsai, Changlang, Lower Dibang Valley, Khonsa, and Itanagar participated.

The orientation helped participants understand eight key areas for organizational development: NPO compliance, governance, finance and accounts, MIS, program management, human resource management, media and communications, and leadership. Sessions were conducted by senior members of Northeast Together Network, including Dimgong Rongmai, ED of RNBA; Piyush Saurabh Sharma, ED of SANJOG and Convenor of Northeast Together Network; and Liinai Margaret, ED of MOSONiE Socio Economic Foundation. Their presence encouraged discussion and practical exchange of knowledge among participants.









Future Ready Leaders Fellowship Selection

Mr. Chandan Prasad, CEO of BLCCT, was selected as one of the 20 fellows for the Future Ready Leaders Fellowship (FRL), supported by the Royal Enfield Social Mission and implemented by Roots to Branches. This fellowship has been an important step in strengthening leadership for creating impactful change.





As part of the fellowship, BLCCT participated in a four-day residential program at the Centre for Development Initiative, Mirza, Guwahati. The program provided in-depth learning on sustainable development and leadership, enhancing BLCCT's capacity to contribute more effectively to community transformation.

Building on this nine-month fellowship, BLCCT's future-ready leadership will guide strategic initiatives, foster innovation, and strengthen its impact in empowering communities. The experience has also equipped the team with skills in stakeholder engagement, project planning, and resource mobilization, which will help in designing programs that are more responsive to community needs. By applying these learnings, BLCCT will contribute to creating sustainable solutions and scaling up initiatives that benefit the most vulnerable sections of society.



Convergence Programs

Empowering Livelihoods through Financial Inclusion & Handloom Development

BLCCT continued its mission to strengthen rural communities through training, financial literacy, and livelihood interventions. We conducted a Financial Inclusion training in collaboration with SBI Kharsang at TBCA Nongtham Village, Changlang District. The session, led by Mr. Niraj from SBI, enabled artisans, SHG members, and local leaders to better understand financial access and management, paving the way for stronger economic participation.

This initiative is crucial as it addresses the core challenges of rural development. Many in these areas lack access to basic banking services like savings accounts, credit, and insurance, which are essential for building a resilient financial future. By equipping participants with the knowledge to open bank accounts, apply for small loans, and understand the benefits of digital transactions.





General Meeting of CLF - Khun-Ta-Nau Multi-Purpose Cooperative Society

IThe first Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Khun-Ta-Nau Multi-Purpose Cooperative Society was successfully held on 18th February 2025 at Piyong, Namsai. The event was attended by officials from the Circle Office, Piyong, ArSRLM (DMM and BMMU team), DDM (NABARD), representatives from BLCCT, Sanjog NGO, Kudumbashree NRO, community leaders, and SHG members.



Promoted by ArSRLM, the society has transitioned from the Khun-Ta-Nau Cluster Level Federation (CLF) and is now registered under the Cooperative Societies Act. This milestone reflects the Government of India's vision of "Sahkar se Samriddhi" (Prosperity through Cooperation), strengthening the cooperative movement at the grassroots level.

The AGM featured the presentation of the progress report, future action plans, and strategic initiatives, reaffirming the society's commitment to rural development and livelihood enhancement through collective cooperation.





Orientation & Exposure on Natural Farming Methods

As part of our continuous effort to strengthen agricultural knowledge and practices, an Orientation and Exposure Visit was organized to Surajmukhi Farmer Producer Co. Ltd., Sadiya Block, Tinsukia District. During the visit, our team interacted with local farmers and gathered valuable insights on natural farming methods, pest management practices, and other innovative agricultural interventions. The visit provided practical exposure and enhanced understanding of sustainable farming techniques, which can be replicated to benefit farmer communities in our project areas.







State Seminars

NABARD Seminar on Credit Outreach Program, Itanagar

BLCCT participated in the two-day Credit Outreach Programme held at Itanagar and Namsai, graced by Hon'ble Finance Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman, along with the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh, and other dignitaries.

During the event, BLCCT was entrusted with initiatives to uplift rural marginalised communities through:

- Rural Haat for artisans and farmers in Changlang under NABARD
- Integrated Floriculture & Beekeeping for 40 marginalised farmers in Namsai under NABARD
- Skill Development Programme on Tribal Jewellery Making (Wancho craft) in Longding under SIDBI
- Capacity building through installation of computer embroidery machines in CFC/Cluster/OFPO in Nongtham & Changlang under SIDBI







NABARD State Credit Seminar, Arunachal Pradesh

I was honoured to participate in the NABARD Arunachal Pradesh Regional Office's State Credit Seminar for FY 2025-26 held in Itanagar on February 11th. This important event, chaired by Chief Secretary Shri Manish Kumar Gupta, IAS, saw the release of the State Focus Paper for 2025-26, projecting a credit potential of ₹1689.90 crore for the priority sector. This paper will be instrumental in guiding banks' credit planning and the state government's development initiatives.

The seminar brought together key stakeholders including government officials, representatives from RGU, banks, NGOs, and civil society, all focused on boosting economic growth and rural development in Arunachal Pradesh. Discussions revolved around critical issues such as increasing credit flow, promoting financial inclusion, fostering skill development, and supporting sustainable agriculture. The emphasis was on empowering farmers, entrepreneurs, and self-help groups through enhanced credit access and innovative programs.

As Founder and CEO of BLCCT, I was privileged to share our organization's interventions for rural communities, highlighting the valuable support we receive from NABARD. It was inspiring to be part of such a collaborative effort aimed at driving positive change and sustainable progress in the state. The seminar underscored the importance of partnerships and strategic planning in achieving inclusive growth and empowering the people of Arunachal Pradesh. I believe that through continued collaboration and a focus on innovative solutions, we can unlock the immense potential of the state and its communities.

A field visit was conducted to Balinong, Changlang District, along with AGM NABARD Shri Kamal Roy, Shri Wangman Ronrang (Gaon Bura of Balinong), Shri Chandan Prasad (CEO, BLCCT), and members of the Rera Welfare Society (RWS). The team inspected the proposed site for a Rural Haat and held discussions on its feasibility. Additionally, the RWS office was visited to review their ongoing activities and explore opportunities for collaborative development initiatives.

Environment



Climate resilient project on -Integrated Floriculture & Bee Keeping

FGD & Baseline with Community:

On November 13, 2024, SANJOG's technical partners, Abhinash Mazumdar (M.Sc. Agriculture, specialist in Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry) and Dipankar Haloi(M.Sc. Agriculture, specialized in Plant Protection) visited Alubari, Chowkham, for the NABARD-supported Integrated Floriculture and Bee-Keeping Project. The team conducted a baseline survey and interacted with the community, gathering key insights to align scientific interventions with local needs.





Inauguration

BLCCT's project at Alubari, Chowkham, formally launched with 43 farmers participating in a floriculture and bee-keeping session. Following this, fields were prepared with manure by December 23, 2024. Capacity-building sessions on production and culture were held from December 24-26, 2024, with key BLCCT staff and farmers.





Training

Building on the inaugural sessions and field preparations, a training programme on floriculture and beekeeping was conducted in Alubari on 24th December 2024. The initiative, funded by NABARD in collaboration with KVK, Namsai, opened new livelihood opportunities for the farming community.

During the programme, farmers were introduced to innovative techniques in flower cultivation and beekeeping. Forty participants received flower seeds and beehives, allowing them to gain hands-on experience in nurturing flowers and producing high-quality honey.











On-Ground Training

Continuing the momentum, BLCCT, in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Namsai, conducted a three-day on-ground training on Integrated Floriculture and Beekeeping. All 42 participating farmers attended the programme, which focused on building hands-on expertise in core farming practices.

With technical support from Sanjog, farmers received practical exposure to bed making, weed control, plantation processes, and methods for protecting seeds and plants. The sessions were designed to strengthen both knowledge and practice, enabling farmers to apply improved techniques in their own fields.





Input distribution to Farmers

As part of the Integrated Floriculture and Beekeeping Project, 43 farmers were provided with Marigold seeds and Gladiolus corms to begin cultivation. The distribution was carried out in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Namsai, with technical guidance from Sanjog.

Through this initiative, farmers were equipped to cultivate high-value flowers, strengthening their practical skills and opening avenues for improved income generation.







PMRC Meeting

A Project Monitoring and Review Committee (PMRC) meeting was convened at Alubari, Aspirational Block Chongkham, Namsai, to review the ongoing Floriculture cum Beekeeping Project.

The meeting brought together Subject Matter Specialists (KVK), the Block Mission Manager (ArSRLM), trainers and directors from Sanjog, the CEO of BLCCT, and project field staff. It provided a platform to assess progress, address challenges, and strengthen strategies for effective project implementation.



Site visit, following plantation of flower crops.

A ground visit was conducted in Chowkham Block, Namsai District. The team observed 100% germination of Gladiolus flowers, which have now begun blooming—marking a successful start to this innovative livelihood initiative in the aspirational district of Namsai.

The intervention covered 42 households, aiming to enhance farmers' additional income through floriculture and beekeeping.



Site Visit - 100% Germination and blooming stage

A site visit was conducted to the ongoing NABARD-funded FSPF project. The Gladiolus flowers showed promising growth, reflecting successful initial cultivation.

In Phase II, Marigold and Gerbera flowers are planned for cultivation in 10 polyhouses, accompanied by the distribution of beehives following farmer training. These activities aim to further enhance livelihoods through floriculture and apiculture.





Trained 42 farmers with Rs.65,000 profit in first Cycle

Promoting Climate-Resilient Livelihoods

Eri and Muga Value Chain in Mohbol Gaon under Ghilamara block, Lakhimpur

On December 27, 2024, BLCCT conducted an awareness program in Ghilamora Mohbol Gaon, Lakhimpur. The event, attended by over 30 women from local Self-Help Groups (SHGs), aimed to empower them with livelihood opportunities in the Eri and Muga value chain.

The program featured discussions on creating a sustainable cluster for long-term success and explored various non-farm activities within traditional crafts. Dignitaries, including Dr. Bhupen Saikia and Chandan Prasad, were present to support the initiative.



Awareness Program on Eri & Muga Value Chain in Mohbol Village

Building on this initial engagement, on 15th March 2025, BLCCT, in collaboration with SANJOG and supported by Resham Sutra, conducted a follow-up awareness program in Mohbol Village, Ghilamara Block, Lakhimpur District. The initiative aimed to further promote livelihood opportunities for rural women and strengthen cluster development. The program was attended by Dr. Bhupen Saikia, Mrs. Sabitri Gogoi, Mr. Chandan Prasad (Founder & CEO, BLCCT), and other stakeholders. Ms. Lucky Chutia, Program Manager, BLCCT, welcomed participants and outlined the organization's objectives, while Mr. Prasad highlighted the Gram Samriddhi 2.0 mission and shared insights from the baseline survey conducted in December 2024.

Through technical support from SANJOG and in partnership with Resham Sutra, a Memorandum of Understanding was established to reduce spinning drudgery and expand the Eri and Muga cluster to 300 women over three months. Resham Sutra contributed by setting up a Rural Experience Centre (REC) and providing three Sonalika Muga Reeling Machines and three Abha Eri Spinning Machines, equipping the women with the tools and training needed to strengthen their livelihoods.









Trained 60 women, out of which 20 women are now independently earning ₹7,000-₹11,000+ per month each.

Exposure Visits

Educational Exposure Visit for Martha Nursing Students in Namsai

Martha Nursing Training School conducted an educational visit for its students to the Water Treatment Plant, Marua, the Old Age Home, Golden Pagoda, and the De-Addiction and Rehabilitation Centre. These visits provided students with the the opportunity to learn outside classroom, gain practical exposure, and develop new skills and interests, complementing their academic training while enhancing their understanding of community services.







Clinical Exposure Visit to Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh

Our ANM final-year students have embarked on a six-month clinical exposure program at Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh. This comprehensive initiative provides them with hands-on experience in a dynamic medical environment, exposing them to a wide range of medical cases. The program is designed to consolidate their theoretical knowledge and equip them with the practical skills essential for their future careers. Through active participation in patient care and observation of diverse medical procedures, students will develop the confidence and competence required to excel in the healthcare field. This initiative reflects our ongoing commitment to delivering high-quality practical education and preparing skilled healthcare professionals.











Programme on Mental Health & Wellbeing of Children & Adolescents

On September 10, 2024, Bethel Life Care Charitable Trust organized a program on "Awareness and Counselling on Mental Health and Wellbeing of Children & Adolescents" at Dikom High School, Dibrugarh district, Assam, coinciding with World Suicide Prevention Day. Recognizing the critical importance of mental health during adolescence, the program aimed to equip students with knowledge to identify signs of distress and adopt healthy coping mechanisms.



Ms. Washima Rahman, Technical Consultant for Education, BCP-UNICEF, delivered the keynote address, focusing on life skills strategies to manage stress, build resilience, and maintain mental wellness. Her session included practical and recreational activities to enhance concentration and mental clarity. The program was attended by Sh. Palash Jyoti Sharma, Principal of Dirial TE Model High School; Mr. Chandan Prasad, Founder and CEO of BLCCT; the Program Manager of BLCCT; Umesh Pator, President of AATSA Dikom; school teachers; and over 250 students of Dikom High School. The event was hosted by Bornali Mohan, Assistant Teacher at Dikom High School and Student Counsellor of BLCCT.

Internship

BLCCT welcomed four BSW students from Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong, for a two-month internship, providing them with practical exposure and fostering a culture of learning and knowledge exchange.



The BSW students from Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong, successfully completed their two-month internship from 1st April to 28th May 2025. The internship provided them with valuable practical exposure and contributed to their professional development in the field of social work.







NCPCR Survey

As part of our ongoing initiatives, we have diligently conducted the NCPCR (National Commission for Protection of Child Rights) Survey within the designated area. Throughout this process, we engaged extensively with educators, community members, and parents to gather their perspectives on matters concerning children's rights. The survey aims to provide valuable insights to strengthen child protection mechanisms and inform evidence-based interventions.

International Nurses Day

Martha Nursing Training School celebrated International Nurses Day at its premises, honouring the dedication and professionalism of nurses.
